During the year 1989the organization started functioning from Mayurbhanj district with active participation of the community and now concentrating in the district of Kandhamal emphasizing activities like awareness, education, clinical health services, community mobilization, formation and strengthening people’s organization, women leaderships, focusing on micro-finance.

NATURE AND COVERAGE OF THE ORGANIZATION

Non- profit making , non-political and non-govt. organization for social development ,working within Orissa. Presently it is working in 60 villages of Daringbadi block of Kandhamal district as its focus area, where CBOs and SHGs are in process of managing and accelerating the development activities. activities in a sensible and participatory manner. Presently 50 SHGs, 60 village development Committees, youth groups who are in the process of self development.

- Promote socio- legal – economic- justices, independence and opportunities for self-expression without fear, oppression and subjugation in the family and society.

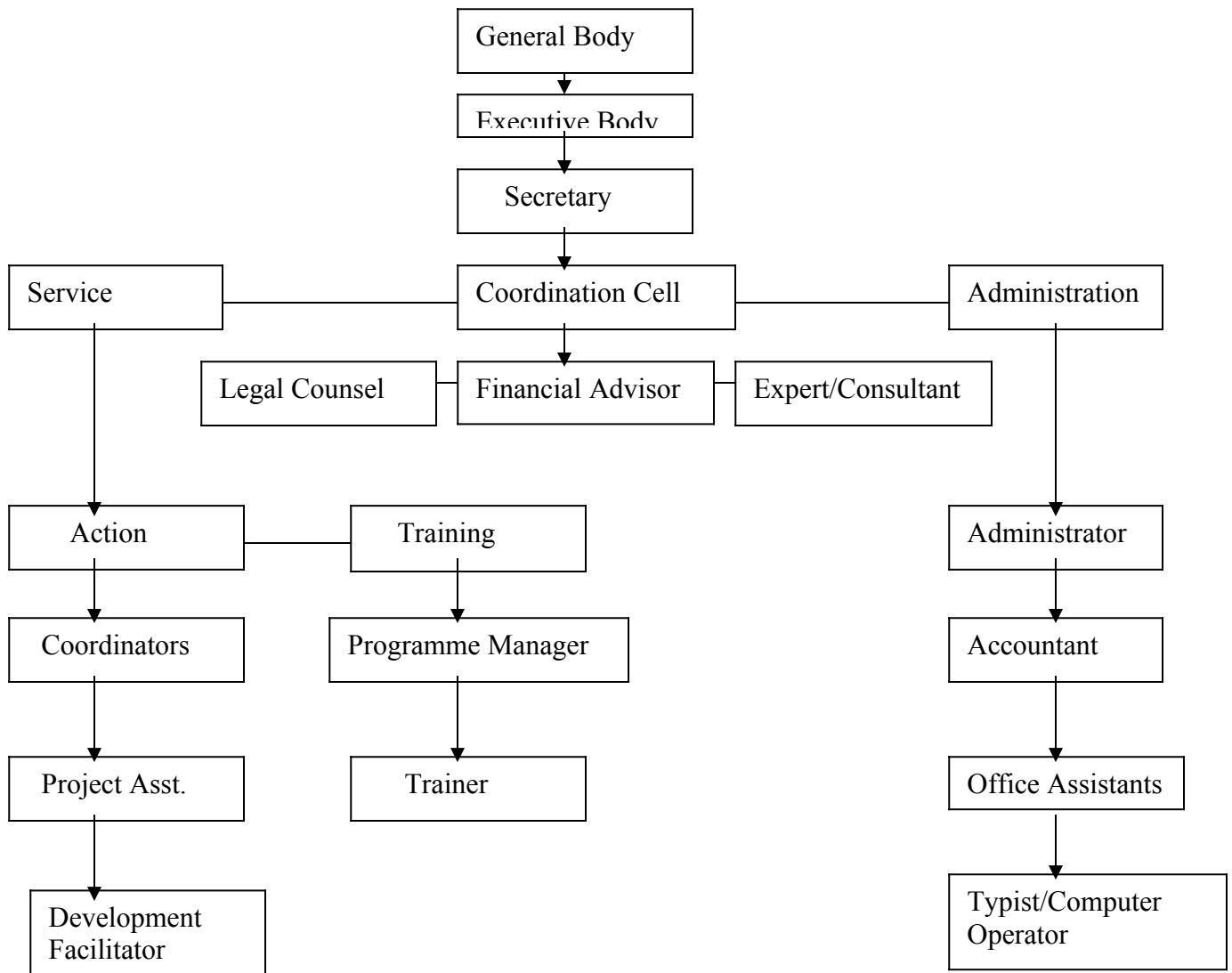
STRATEGY & OBJECTIVES
