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## INTRODUCTION

### ORIGIN OF THE ORGANIZATION

SAHANUBHUTI is a philanthropic grass root level organization started by a group of likeminded people from different professions in tribal district of Mayurbhanj in the year 1988 and registered under Society Registration Act of 1860 in the year 1989 at Baripada of same Mayurbhanj district .The main motto of the organization then was to develop rural communities specially tribals and dalits and other marginalized communities in the field of socio-economic and politics . Hence the organization had implemented initially some awareness programmes and different economic development activities among women and farmers. But when it expanded its activities into Kandhamal district of Odisha in the year 1999, it emphasized on community organizations, empowerment and sustainable development focusing on health, education, women development and livelihood programme and since then addressing various local issues till date covering Ganjam, Gajapati , Kandhamal and Mayurbhanj districts of Odisha.

The organization adopted the strategies of awareness building to community organization and then into empowerment which has been made them enough to become capable themselves to take inclusive and right decision for their own lasting development. This year also the organization took effort of helping community especially most needy children for their holistic development focusing on education, health care and child care.



## **CORE ACTIVITIES OF THE YEAR**

SAHANUBHUTI continued implementing child centered project named “Love the One project” since last 2018 onwards. This project focused basically on education, health care and child care of most needy and disabled children. This project had started initially from 2018 in Ganjam district and gradually extended into Gajapati district of Odisha, however, from 2022 onwards, this programme has been implementing in Kandhamal district too. The goal of the project is to ensure holistic development of most needy and vulnerable children by providing free education, health care and child care in three districts of Odisha. In order to achieve the goal and objectives of the programme, the organization had been conducted both institutional and community level activities.

During the year, major activities such as running Five numbers of Early Pediatric Interventional Care Centres (EPICs), Five Supplementary Education Centre (SEC), one Children Therapy centre for special need children (disabled children), one clinic and community awareness camps were emphasized in all three districts. The organization had also initiated some welfare and awareness activities in Mayurbhanj districts. The organization had successfully implemented all its programme during reporting year. However, due to fund constraint, major decision was taken in the middle of the year to closed down few EPIC centers as well as to minimized staff. Still then, there was a good cooperation and support from different stake holder's. As a result, the organization had achieved its goal and objectives to a greater extent.

## **HUMAN RESOURCES**

Human resource plays vital roles in implementing the programme successful. Till six months, of the reporting period, there were 142 staffs and by the end the year there were 101 staffs altogether. As it implements the programme in three districts with comprising five EPICs (Three in Ganjam, one in Gajapati and one in Kandhamal districts, Six supplementary Education centre (SEC), four in Ganjam and two in Gajapati district, one CTC and One clinic with central project office at Ganjam district. There were 50% of professional staffs who were from medical back ground, social work, IT, education and finance sectors. Following are the details of staffs under department wise in last year.

Love the One project is basically child centered project and the children were from the age group of 2 to 17 . And majority children were below 10 years, hence the organization had preferred to appoint more women staffs who were taken care children very sincerely with motherly love and affection ,which fulfilled the purpose of the programme. Apart from this, the organization employed destitute women like widows, divorced women etc in the project to support them financially at the same time support their children in the project .By doing this the organization give benefit both the mothers as well as their children in this programme.

The organization conducted following activities in the year, they were:

### EDUCATION PROGRAMME

Education is the cornerstone of development of every individual as well as of the society at a large. From the inception, SAHANUBHUTI has been addressing educational issue in its operational area. Hence, it has implemented various educational activities in previous years such as Residential education programme , life skill and livelihood skill educational programme ,

dalit educational programme and special summer classes etc. However, since last 2018 onwards, it implements Early pediatric interventional care Project which is also known as love the One project. In the reporting period, under this project, it run five EPICs in all three districts and six SEC and one Children Therapy Centre covering around 555 children.

## EARLY PAEDIATRIC INTERVENTIONAL CARE-EPICS

SAHANUBHUTI had run Five Early Pediatric interventional Care (EPIC) centres in the reporting period in all three districts. Out of which three EPICs run in Ganjam district, one EPICs in Paralakhemundi of Gajapati district, and one EPIC run in Bramunigoan of Kandhamal district.

The main motto of running this centre is to prepare and motivate children of below five years age group to attend school. This programme gives foundation to the kids to build their future. In this programme, all kids were fully taken care of their physical, mental and educational development in the centre.



Basically for EPIC-1 centre, children from Khadasing, Amabapua of Berhampur municipality were taken, for EPIC-2, children from Gopalpur NAC ,New Boxipalli and Dharampur of Rangeilunda block and for EPIC-3 and EPIC-4, children from Geta slum, Somonath Nagar,Khaja stree and Somonathnagar of Berhampur Municipality were joined where as for EPIC-P1, of Paralakhemunidi ,

children from Nilakhanthapur,Totabado and for EPIC-K1, children from Gumandi, Mundamaha, Goberkuti and Ulipadar of Kandhamal district werejoined.

In each EPIC, a team of seven to Nine staffs have got appointed where three teachers, one toddler care taker, one house keeper, one facilitator, one health worker and



one to two driver s work dedicatedly. Hence around 60 staffs were appointed in last year for all 5 EPICs to take care of 134 kids in the field of health, education and child care.

All centers followed same time schedule of arriving, departure, grooming, teaching, feeding, and taking rest. Special syllabus including teaching on different themes, counting numbers, rhymes, painting etc was conducted in the centers. The methods of teaching were through crafts, games, drama, songs, dances, practical study etc



In order to make children happy and special, each kid's birth day was celebrated with cakes cutting and gift presentation. Children were provided food four times every day including one



breakfast, two times snacks and lunch in all centers and menu chart had been prepared for a week with different items for physical and mental growth. Effort had also made to involve parents of the children in the programme, hence staffs of the concern centre had visited community every two months and interacted with parents about the situation of the kids with regards to health and

educational status .Every quarter, Parents Teachers meeting had conducted in all centers where, parents attend the meeting at centre and different issues including progress of education health, child's behavior etc were discussed vividly.

Emphasis was also given to the staffs of the centres to build their capacity. Hence, the organization, conductd time to time training and orientation programme for all teachers as well as other staffs of the EPICs .Mostly, the senior staffs and from resource persons from outside imparted training on vision and mission , objectives ,core values, phonic, teaching and learning methods, team building etc. Apart from this, all staffs were also made aware of safety of fire.



In order to educate children on various important topics such as police station, post office, railway

station, hospitals, parks, sea, fire station, train and station etc, Children were taken to various such places and children could learn by seeing. In Berhampur EPICs and weekly once, there was film show for the kids on different

### **GRADUATION CEREMONY OF EPIC KIDS:**

The organization had organized graduation ceremony where EPICs kids were promoted to UKG during beginning of the reporting period. Around 42 kids from Kandhamal, Paralakhemundi and Berhampur EPICs graduated to UKG centre. Children who promoted in Berhampur EPICs had admitted in UKG run by the project whereas the promoted children from EPICs in Paralakhemundi and Kandhamal joined



in different nearby government schools. The children got promotion based on their best performances in all activities as well as progress of academic learning. Also most of the children promoted based on their smartness, inherent quality and imitating skill.

### **PRE-SCHOOL PROGRAMME**

The organization had run pre-school both at Berhampur as well as Paralakhemundi Hub where 15 children had admitted in Bahadurpeta, Berhampur and 10 students had admitted in PKD. The motive of this preschool was to prepare the children for standard one. Since it was just joyful learning for children, hence UKG syllabus were followed and there were four teachers appointed to teach the children in Berhampur so



also in

Paralakhemundi. Like school programme, the centre run between 9.30 am to 3.30 pm. Children were provided with two times snacks and one time lunch. Like formal school, there were quarterly, half yearly




and annual examinations conducted. Like EPICs children, birthday celebration, and different special days were observed to make children happy and feel good and make them aware about the importance of the day. Children were also provided transport facility freely for their safety.

## SUPPLEMENTARY EDUCATION PROGRAMME

The supplementary education programme was covered with tuition programme, counselling programme, health support programme and children's club programme for the community children .

### TUTION TO THE COMMUNITY CHILDREN:

There were three tuition centres run in Berhampur municipality, one in Gopalpur NAC and two centres run in Paralakhemundi of Gajapati district .It assisted the children to parallel their learning style and topics with their different school syllabus. Adequate Teachers in every S.E.C continued their service perfectly so as to cooperate children additional knowledge based on their regular studies at school. Kids were cooperated in doing their home works them and cleared their



doubts too. Monthly Exams were also conducted to test and measure their learning standard and improvement in studies. During studies, as usual breakfast, milk, lunch and fruits were provided to children to ensure sound health and to concentrate in studies. Transportation Team used to pick up and drop back children at the centres to ensure children attending classes in time as many lives in scattered

area. Nearly 100 children including 9<sup>th</sup> and 10<sup>th</sup> class students access such facilities from SEC centres. Teachers always tried to implement creative learning such as making flexible learning environment, student choice, technology integration with Art and crafts. The services such as transportation, study materials, food and health services provided freely. Sports, Games and Birthday celebration of

children in time as per study schedule, made the children more smart and interested to acknowledge achievements.

### **COUNSELLING PROGRAMME:**

There were five members of counselling team who attended the centres and supported the children in counselling .Since the children were from different back ground, who needed constant guidance and counselling to attend the centre.The team spend time individually with each child, discussed with them about their various problems, and counselled them carefully and tried to dealt

with their personal and family issues .Because of regular visit and conduct counselling, good numbers of community children attend the centres and get motivated to continue their education and dream for better future.



### **CHILDREN'S CLUB:**

The organization had also formed the children's club where the community children including children who attend tuition, participated in different activities of the club. Usually the club conducts extracurricular activities such as different indoor games, quiz competition, music, dance, teaching on good



manners,  
speaking skills,



etc to attract into the centres as well as supported for best learning.. In all SEC centres, children's club had been formed and monthly twice different activities were conducted in order to make children knowledgeable, smart and potentials to be good human being as well as to build good career.

## COACHING TO 9<sup>TH</sup> & 10<sup>TH</sup> CLASS STUDENTS:

There were nine numbers of 10th class students and seven numbers of 9<sup>th</sup> class students supported to get admission in Gyan Vikas school who were constantly got coaching from the professional teachers under Love the One Project. However, all students had appeared their quarterly, half



yearly and annual exam in the school itself where they



were enrolled. Out of Nine students from, seven students had passed with good division where as two students were unsuccessful and they will be appear compartment examinations in one subject again. Really the SEC

programme helped a lot to the slum and rural poor students as they have been ensuring their self respect and dignity in the society through these programmes.

## MEETINGS WITH PARENTS:

There were regular meetings conducted in every quarter with parents of SEC and UKG children. In every meeting, discussion was made about children's education, their improvement, attendance of the children, rules and regulation of the centre etc. However, It was found active participation of its members in every meeting and thus, there was lots of improvement taken place in the centre in all aspects.



Time to time teachers trainings were conducted for all teachers and core team members of the SEC and UKG about teaching methods, teacher's behavior, preparation of study materials, phonic, management of children's behavioral issues etc. The trained senior teachers were imparted training physically as well as virtually.

## **SUPPORT FOR HIGHER EDUCATION:**

The organization had sponsored two teachers for B.Ed course, one student for 12th class (science stream) in Centurion science college, Chhatrapur, and one student for 8<sup>th</sup> standard in Holy Angle school, Gopalpur. The organization had paid full admission fees as well as other expenses and committed to support till complete their courses and classes. All these beneficiaries are from very poor back ground and were unable to go for higher education. Looking to their educational career and poor back ground, the organization took decision to support them.

## **OBSERVATION & CELEBRATION**

The SECs and UKG had observed various important days such as children's day, sports day, Independence day, republic days, teachers' day etc to make aware about the importance of the day to the students. During observation of importance days, different prominent guests were invited to join and boost the children. Children had performed various cultural activities during the observations that helped children to expose their hidden talents, skills and potentials. The centers tried to help children giving maximum inputs to gain knowledge about the important days that were observed in the centers. There were snacks and sweets distributed to all the participants at the end of every celebrations.

## **MASS BIRTHDAY CELEBRATION OF KIDS:**

In order to make children happy and good feeling, all the centers celebrated children's birth day with cake cuttings, singing birth day songs and distributing gifts. It had been a special and great moment to enjoy by the children in every birth day celebration. During the reporting period, mass birth day had celebrated which again made the day special for the children.



## **CHILDREN THERAPY CENTRE PROGRAMES**

The centre runs only for the children with special needs those who are differently able physically and mentally. There were 17 such children who had been taken care in the center by

the trained and professional staffs psychologists, therapists, counselors, and pediatric specialists, teachers, Admin-cum-Accountant and supportive staffs who work with children to address their specific needs and promote their overall well-being. This center has all the required equipment needed for the children .The table given below is detailed with different kind of disabilities of the children according to their gender:

The goal of a children's therapy center is to support children and their families to address various difficulties of disable children, improve their mental and physical health, and enhance their overall quality of life.

The Children therapy center had specialized facilities that provides a range of therapeutic services to children and adolescent who had been experiencing emotional, behavioral, developmental, or psychological challenges. In this year, following major activities undertaken by the centre:

**SPECIAL EDUCATION:** Since all children special need children, hence specialized curriculum was designed to address the learning profiles of children where Art and craft education, play therapy and sensory activities were included in their curriculum. These curriculums had provided them to



create opportunity of self-expression, creativity, skill development, and therapeutic benefits, considering their unique abilities, needs, and challenges.

The organization conducted **Smaller classes** to allow for more individualized attention and support that really benefited the children in a greater extent. The team of the centre also had prepared **Individualized Education Plans (IEPs)** that outlined their specific learning goals and the strategies and accommodations needed to achieve them.



**THERAPEUTIC SUPPORT:** The Children Therapy Centre provided access to various therapies such as **speech therapy, occupational therapy, and physical therapy** to address specific developmental and communication needs.

**Physiotherapy:** During the reporting period , 8 children got regular **physiotherapy**, Monthly assessment of kids physical and mental health condition, Aids and appliances that help to improve the different conditions of kids are parallel bar, standing frame, stair climb with incline, AFO, knee getter etc.



**Speech Therapy:** One of our trained staff had given **speech therapy** to five kids. She had used different methods such as flash card, books, brush etc. to improve communication .

**Play Therapy** - Play therapy mostly help the children to explore their emotions and learn primary education through different games.

**PARENT AND FAMILY INVOLVEMENT-** Though the CTC rendered day care services to the special children in CTC, still it encouraged active involvement of parents and families in their child's education and therapy activities, hence parents were regularly invited to the centres and conducted counselling session for their better understanding and supporting



the children at home.

**LIFE SKILL TEACHING-** A significant focus of the curriculum in Children therapy centre was on teaching practical day-to-day life skills, including self-care, independence, and vocational skills, to prepare students for adulthood. Our main focus is to train them **Activities of Daily Living (ADL)** like using bathroom, taking a bath, washing hands before and after eating, brushing and combing their hair, wearing their dress by themselves and good manner to our kids in regular basis.

**SPECIAL FOOD SUPPLY AND OTHER SERVICES:** Since, the children are very special and their needs were different, hence foods were prepared according to their liking, so also as per the need of each child, different equipments were supplied for their treatment and improvement.



**OBSERVATION OF IMPORTANT DAYS:** Like other centers, all important days were observed in the centre to involve children to aware about the days in a special manner inviting their parents and guests. Independence day, Republic day, children's day, disable day, teachers' day etc. Each child's birth day was also celebrated with cake cutting and giving gifts so as to make them happy and good feelings.

## HEALTH PROGRAMME

### HEALTH SERVICE THROUGH CLINIC

The health centre of the project render the health service round the clock for the children who are enrolled in the project as well as to other needy children from the community of our operation area. There were a team of eight professional staffs including GNM, nurses, male health workers, admin staff and other supporting staffs appointed who involved in doing health check up , distribute medicine, help in consultation, different diagnosis, and referred to different hospitals and clinics in the Berhampur





and Bhubaneswar as well as out of the states like Vizag, Hyderabad, Vellore etc.

The common health problems faced by the children were dental problems, skin issues, eye pain, Mouth ulcer, fever and headaches, injuries and tooth aches and majority of the children caught cough and cold during the year. Health check-ups were done regularly

in the health centre run by the project and for any major issues and surgeries; children were taken to the specialist hospitals such as MKCG, SUM, KIMS and CHB hospitals. For eye problems and dental issue, patients were taken for treatment at LV Prashad and Patro Hospital respectively and for any diagnosis, attended Nidan diagnostic research center, Berhampur.



**Major surgeries-** There were four surgeries done in the reporting year. Each One in the month of April 2024, July 2024, October 2024 and February 2025 .Out of four children , two children were from community( Kandhamal and Ganjam) where as other two were from our centres(SEC and CTC). Two surgeries were done in SUM and KIIMS hospital, Bhubaneswar, one is in STAR Hospital, Hyderabad and another one was in Gurudev Hospital, Berhampur .



Surgeries were done on



fasciotomy (orthopediatric), implant extraction (orthopediatric), ASD(Cardiology), Paelopplasty (urology). All the surgeries were successful and all children were doing

well. For any major treatment, along with patient, the clinic staffs as well as children's guardian/parent attended.

## COMMUNITY HEALTH CARE

Community health care is another main activity in Love the One project of SAHANUBHUTI. A team of three members involved in this activity. Basically they made awareness to the women group specially to the pregnant and distress women and some vulnerable families on family planning, antenatal care, family counselling, health and hygiene education in different communities of our project area. Apart from this the team had made child counselling in all the project centres. Mainly it focussed on health aspect of the working mother in the community. Around 62 mothers were met and counselled, 32 families were visited and taken care of family issues and around 80 children were met and made personal counselling. By conducting this programme, many working women, and families as well as children had enjoyed good health and healthy and happy environment.



## COMMUNITY WELFARE ACTIVITIES

The organization had implemented some community support programme in Mayurbhanj district, where the organization is registered. The major activities carried out in the district were as follows:

### BLANKET DISTRIBUTION TO DISABLED & OLD AGED PERSONS

As per the action plan of January 2025 of Love the One project of SAHANUBHUTI, it had organized blanket distribution programme to disabled and old aged people of Badjod G.P. of Mayurbhanj District on 09<sup>th</sup> and 10<sup>th</sup> of January 2025 at community hall of Krushna Chandrapur village. Though, there were many disabled as well as old aged persons in the G.P. but the organization selected 40 most disabled & 40 old aged persons and distributed blankets to protect from cold in the winter.





Prior to this, the organization took the help of some volunteers, ward members and other community leaders of the G.P. in identifying the most disabled as well as old aged people. The blanket distribution programme was conducted in the presence of local Sarapanch ,P.O. of the block , ward member of

Nangalakanta, ward member of K.C.Pur, President of block association of Baripoda block, community leaders and volunteers. With the support of local volunteers and community leaders, this programme had organized and the Director of SAHANUBHUTI was also present. The beneficiaries were really very much pleased along with the PRI members and community leaders as the disabled people got this support in the time of real need.



### **ORIENTATION PROGRAMME FOR WOMEN SHGs:**

The organization had also conducted women SHG orientation programme, at Kalyan Mandop of Bodjhod on dated 10.01.2025 at 3 pm where around 40 women SHGs members from Bhagya jyoti, Siv Shakti, O Ma Sarala, Jaya Shree, Durga Devi and Jagyaseni women group took part.



The director of SAHANUBHUTI along with other volunteers joined the programme and had vivid discussion with the SHG members. Basically, the

director of SAHANUBHUTI had covered following topics during orientation to the group they were, 1. Goal and Objectives of the women group, 2. Management of SHG with regard to documentations 3. Linkages with various other financial institutions and 4. Taking up various feasible IGP activities and their management.

Since , these groups are organized and already engaged in govt supported training cum production centre of special grass called bobai grass and are well trained up in this trade, and do marketing well, however, there are 250 women groups engage in same trade, so they get very low benefit out of this trade. Hence, they are interested to take up some other feasible trade which will have good

market and will have good benefit. The director has proposed many IGP activities such as detergent making, Tailoring, food processing etc and willing to support in providing training to the SHGs. For each trade five women group consisting 50 members are planning go for training and in that way all 200 members will undergo trades and engage in IGP activities in coming future. The organization has planned to arrange such trainings to the women groups for their sustainable economic development.



### **ORGANIZED FOOT BALL TOURNAMENT:**

The organization had organized football tournament in block level with collaboration of Om Shree Siva Shakti youth association , Jhadjamda where around eight football team from Baripada, Betnoti and Kulliana block took part on 04.02.2025. There were eight teams from Baripoda, Betnoti and Kulliana Block of Mayurbhanj district were took part in the tournament. As per the programme schedule, there were four matches organized for quarter final position and two matches were conducted for semifinal position



and one final match was conducted at the end. All matches were conducted for 30 minutes in order to complete the tournament in a day.

The final game was played between Khandala Foot ball club of Kulliana block and Rangamatia club of Baripada block and winner was Khandala Foot ball club .The winner and runner

were awarded with prizes.

In the award ceremony, the guests and organizers such as Mr.Jayanta Joseph and Mr. Santosh Sethy, volunteers of SAHANUBHUTI NGO, the President of Baripoda block forest Mangement committee, village leaders, PRI members, women leaders were present .



The village people including children, youth and other enjoyed the programme happily. On the occasion of Makar Sankranti, Om Shree Siva Shakti youth association of Jhadjamda village of Baripada block organize football tournament and other sports competitions and cultural programme to make entertainment people of these area.

### **ORGANIZED OF SPORTS COMPETITION;**

Sports competition was organized at football ground of Jhadjamda village by Om Shree Siva Shakti youth association of same village with the collaboration of SAHANUBHUTI NGO, K.C.Pur, Dist.Mayurbhanj on 05.02.2025 on the occasion of Makar Sankranti. There were eight numbers of competitions organized by the organizer. Mostly



women, young boys, young girls, children were also took part ,they were ,100 meter running race by girls within the age group of 8-12 years,100 meter running race by boys within the age group of 8-12 years,Pot breaking game for women ,Pot balance race for women, Quize on mathmetics for class one to third class students, Quize on Mathmatics for class 4<sup>th</sup> to 5<sup>th</sup> class students ,Musical chair and 100 meter running race for women.



In the prize distribution ceremony, the chief guest was Mr. Rakesh Singh, the youth leader of the block, Smt. Sukuntula Marandi, guest of honour Mr. Joteen Mohanta, Mr.Jayanta Joseph and Mr. Santosh Sethy, were the volunteers of SAHANUBHUTI NGO, and all the board members of the club, PRI members, women leaders were present . The village people including children, youth and

other enjoyed the programme happily. There was a cultural programme conducted in the evening where folk dance, modern dance and various cultural activities performed by the members of the Om Shree Shakti youth .

## CAPACITY BUILDING PROGRAMME

### TRAINING TO PROJECT STAFFS:

There were two trainings conducted for whole project staffs at training centre of Love the One project, Naveen Bhawan, Panda colony, Berhampur, where all staffs from three districts attended. In every training, two to three resource persons from senior leaders and leadership groups were assigned with different topics who imparted by using power point and various methodology. At the same time there were game and other entertainment programme conducted to create a culture of we feelings, unity, understanding and supportive each other . The first training conducted in the month of July, and resource persons were Dr. Rahul, Physiotherapist and Mr. Debasish, HR coordinator who took topic on technique to prevent heart chuck and EPF and its different benefits. The second training, conducted in the month of November on child care and the resource persons were Priyanka Joseph, clinic coordinator and Mr. Hanok, field coordinator, Paralakhemundi .The trainings were very much beneficial for the staffs that helped them individually as well as in implementing the project.



### PROGRAMME IMPLEMENTING STRATEGIES:

The organization had adopted various strategies to achieve its project goal and objectives. It had conducted annual project and budget planning, conducted monthly planning meeting, monthly activity review meeting and monthly finance review meeting along with monitor the project by regular visit to all centers, interacting with team and children and observing all activities, collect activity and case study reports every months etc.



## Monthly review meeting with senior level staffs:

Every month, the organization had conducted project review meeting among senior level staffs along with director. In this meeting, review had done on the previous month's activity, various centres' issues and plan for the following month's activity. Most of the decisions had taken in this meeting. It was a platform to present all departments' centre issues and get suggestions and resolved various issues of all



centers. The senior level teams updated their previous month's unit's activity report and proposed their activity plan and got approval from the director and funders. Funders were also directly involved in the project so, after recommendation by the senior leaders and director, funds for the month were allotted.

## Monthly review meeting with admin and account staffs:

The organization also conducted monthly review meetings among admin as well as account staffs for smooth functioning of the project. Monthly activity meeting as well as finance review meetings was conducted every month which led by the Director, SAHANUBHUTI and Finance officer respectively. All the administration team (Documentation and account team) of different units used to attend these meetings. In monthly activity review meeting, discussion were made on monthly progress of activities, monthly



activity

reports, case studies, different issues on documentations etc.

The staffs, submit the monthly progress report following to the specific report formats and at the same time they also submit the action plan of the following month of their concern departments. Where as in finance review meeting, finance related documentations, submission of bills timely, settlement of advance and other finance related issues were discussed and

resolved. These two meetings had really helped to maintain documentations of both activity and finance properly and timely and develop their reporting skills and knowledge which ultimately strengthen organization's documentation and finance aspects.



**Training/ meetings participated outside:** The organization had received several trainings/meetings from outside through online as well as physically. Two participants from organization attended 15th CSR leadership Summit organized on 23r Jan 2025 at Hotel Excellency, Bhubaneswar where many CSR agencies attended and got opportunity to share about the activities of our



organization for further linkages. The organization had also attended EPF training organized at EPF Zonal training Institute, Calcutta on 27<sup>th</sup> and 28<sup>th</sup> 2024 June 2024 where two participants from the organization had participated.



Again the organization took part a workshop a t IIMTcampus Bhubaneswar organized by ENGRACE FOUNDATION on 11<sup>th</sup> September 2024 on different funding avenues. It had also attended training on ARC webinar series conducted by the accessibility Research centre on different topics on disability persons. As a member in Odisha peace network, the organization had also attended different workshops organized by Odisha Peace Network in the reporting year.



## CONCLUSION

The reporting period was challenging period as some centers closed down at the same time some staffs also left out due to shortage of funds. However, community centre programme like SEC, children's club, counseling programme and community health service for the children were introduced that had been a good respond and remarkable achievements. These activities had developed close bonding with the community that really helped to identify some more community issues such alcoholism, group conflicts etc which again planned to address in the future by organizing and empowering the community.

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
